



Vaccination Reactions

Most horses have no problem with routine vaccinations. The most common vaccination reaction is localized swelling and sensitivity at the site of injection. There may also be muscle soreness and stiffness. This can occur at any site of the injection and usually appears 24 to 48 hrs after administration.

A more systemic reaction is also possible, manifesting as a loss of appetite, lethargy, and mild fever around 102 degrees. This problem may occur 24 to 48 hrs after administration. Either situation is easily remedied with 2gm of bute per day for 3 to 5 days.
